learn it? <i>Education Level</i> – What is	
the education level of the	
protagonist? How does this

(gender expectations,	
economic limitations or	
opportunities, etc.)?	
<i>Religion</i> – Is the	
protagonist religious /	
spiritual? How does this	
religion impact their value	
set / experiences?	
<i>Value Set</i> – What other	
factors, if any, influence	
the protagonists values?	
Have they had any	
particular experiences or do	
they belong to any culture	
group that might influence	
their perspective on life /	
what they value?	

## **Physical Location(s)**

Where does it take place? Be specific. If it takes place in more than one area, describe each area in detail. Use as many adjective (descriptive) words as possible. Is it hot, cold, muggy, dreary, dry, mountainous, etc. What does the air feel like? The temperature? What visuals would you see if you were there? Close your eyes, try to imagine it, and do some research!

## **Time Period(s)**
